Getting asset planning basics right – traffic counting and estimation

Understanding traffic demand is a vital component of effective asset management. Good asset management

practice plus great data can provide some insights, but there are a number of key elements that need to be understood to ensure the best outcomes. Learn how REG's Traffic Count Estimation tool helps asset managers make sound asset planning decisions.
